The background on SB 537 is that the supporters behind this legislation had a stated goal of empowering localities to adopt an ordinance for a one for one tree replacement. So, if a solar developer removed 500 acres of trees, the locality could mandate that the solar developer plant new trees on 500 acres. The tree bill applies to all kinds of commercial and residential development, not just solar.

Please note that the supporters of SB 537 mostly supported HB 206, which sets into motion a mitigation process for converting prime ag soils and forested land into solar projects. The regulatory process on HB 206 will take two years and we may end up back in the GA again in the 2023 and/or 2024 Sessions.
